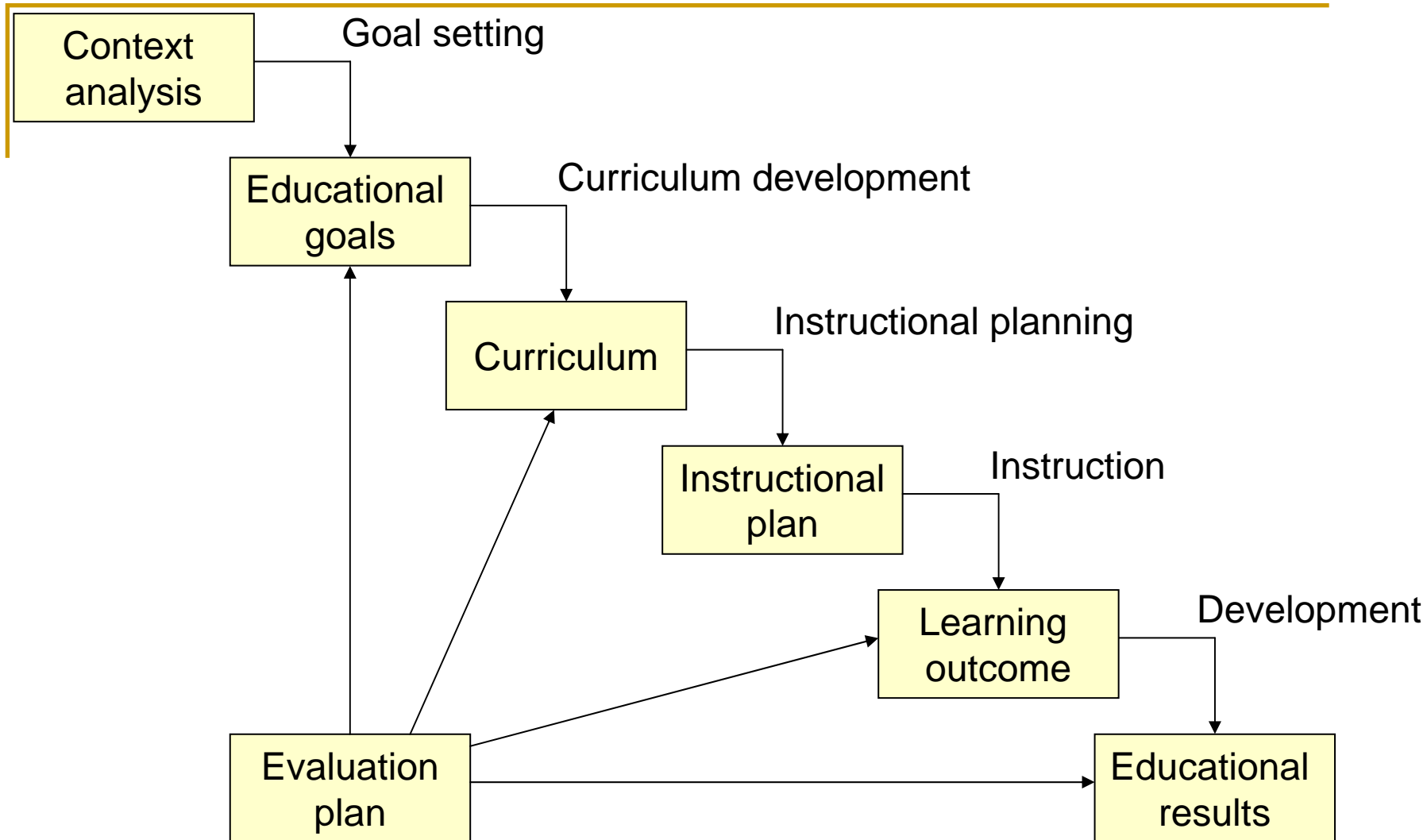

### **Research**

The three EASE partners in Tanzania, Bolivia and Vietnam have completed their 2005 research. The research looked at livelihoods **impacts of rural electrification** with a special emphasis on productive use. The results will soon be made available.

### **Pilot Projects in Vietnam - Micro-hydro Power Plant**

In Vietnam, RCEE is making the final preparations for the installation of a micro-hydro power plant. in Cao Bien village (Thai Nguyen Province). This pilot project will focus on **productive use of the electricity** produced to improve the livelihoods of the villagers.
